Any further diagnostic assessment will be provided and full continuum of care available to patients with positive findings (breast cancer) to reduce barriers to access health care and treatment.</p>

Taylor/Chaplin will provide screening mammograms; diagnostic mammograms; ultrasounds; diagnostic biopsies; financial assessments; and in-house clinical referrals.

For women who face additional challenges such as being new immigrant, experiencing linguistic isolation and other barriers to access timely detection of breast cancer is often delayed until late stages. At SJBC the majority of patients are those women. The funding received through Susan G. Komen Miami/Ft. Lauderdale affiliate allows us to offer screening and diagnostic exams. Program is evaluated by adherence to its calendar of activities, sign-in logs, pre/post-test, intake forms, client results, &amp; provider invoices.</p>
